

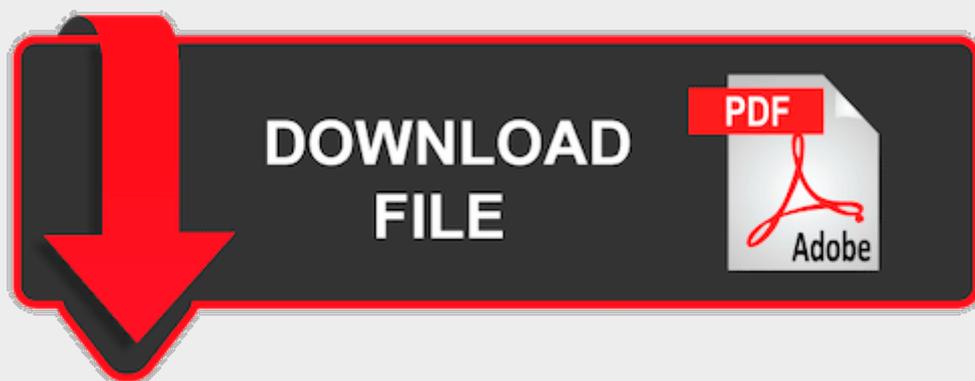

## Reviews of the *Ember from the Sun* by Mark Canter

### 1. Simple fellow

Very few books I read merit taking the time to write a review, but "Ember From the Sun" is exceptional. There's a familiar mythos underlying the story of a people who are defeated by a powerful enemy, but (after a period of waiting) delivered from death or destruction by the return of a

savior. That the story rests upon this mythos is clear from nearly the beginning, but how the author fleshes out this story of deliverance will keep most readers in suspense as well as consternation wondering how it will be resolved. I doubt many readers will successfully predict the book's conclusion — a conclusion so satisfying to me that I immediately went to Google to see if there was a sequel. Sadly, there isn't — but at least my own heart had already been warmed by this Ember from the Sun!
